



Learning to bring out the best in everyone.

## Friday 17th May



We have had a really busy week in Waveney Class. Our theme book was Amazing Aeroplanes by Tony Mitton and Ant Parker. We used Purple Mash to create an

aeroplane pilot with our face and wrote a sentence about where our aeroplane is flying to. We used boxes, paper and Card to make junk model aeroplanes too.



In RE we listened to the story of the wise man who built his house on rock and the foolish man who built his house on sand and we retold the story using the



word **but**, or **but then**. Lots of the Children worked independently on their sentence, using the phonics they have learnt. They said that the wise man made good Choices and they will try to make good Choices too.

In Maths we focessed on 25 (2 tens and 5 ones). We represented 25 in a variety of ways. We looked at times on a timetable and talked about when planes are leaving and arriving. We also looked at clock faces, revised o'clock times, and looked at half past times. Some children also looked at quarter past and quarter to times on the clock. We also talked about what the numbers and marks on the clock mean.

In Phonics, one group has been learning Phase 4 blends cr., pr., sc. and fr., reading and writing words and sentences. We learnt the new tricky word **her** and wrote a sentence beginning with '**She...her...**'. The other group have been learning **j** v w x and the tricky word **the**.

The Nursery Children have counted people on to buses when given a number. They have also enjoyed using the wooden bricks to make buildings and worked together to make London. They loved making food with the mint chocolate playdough and using the watercolour palettes.
