



Learning to bring out the best in everyone.

This week was such a busy week in Waveney Class. We were learning about the ocean and our focus book was Puffin Peter by Petr Horocek. We talked about what creatures Puffin Peter met on his search to find Puffin Paul. Then all the children made suggestions about what other ocean creatures he could have met – turtle, octopus, stingray, dolphin, jellyfish, shark, sealion and many more, showing that we have learnt lots about sea and ocean creatures.







The Children selected drawing media or paints to Create pictures inspired by *Jealous Puffin* by Jim Moir. They were stunning!







In Maths we have worked on number bonds and simple arrays (up to 12). We really enjoyed playing our 3D shape game too!

In Phonics, one group has been revising Phase 4 sounds mp nk and nd, writing words and short sentences in our phonics jotters containing those sounds. We also learnt to read and write the tricky word some. The intervention group has been focussing on C, and reading and writing CVC words.

The Nursery children have also enjoyed bubble painting. They made jellyfish using a paper plate and Crepe paper. Leo and Nancy put on a lovely 'Down in the Jungle' puppet show for the other children too.
