We have come to the end of a very busy half term for Thames Class. The Reception children are well settled and have made a good start to school. The Nursery children have settled in and have made friends with some of the older children. The Year 1 children have been working hard on their new curriculum. Well done everyone!

We have completed our theme of Castles. This week we focussed on the legend of St George and the Dragon. We looked at pictures and watched an animated version of the story.

LITERACY We discussed what we could see in the pictures and talked about the events in the story. Some Children drew illustrations. The Year 1 Children have written exclamation sentences puntuated with an exclamation mark.

CREATIVE We enjoyed making delicious jam tarts. "We had to roll the dough. We had to cut them. Patsy did the jam. They taste very, very lovely." (Maeve)

MATHS Reception have been introduced to number 7 in all its formats. 7 objects for counting, 7 Numicon piece, 7p, 7 o'clock etc. We looked at its position on a number line and said the numbers before and after. We also went

over the names of all the 3D shapes we have been learning about by playing some shape games.

Year 1 have been working on part part whole, finding missing numbers in number sentences and addition in more depth.

PHONICS Reception have been continuing to focus on initial letter sounds, rhymes and blends, in preparation for starting Phase 2 after the holiday. Year 1 have been learning or recapping the Phase 3 digraphs/trigraphs air and ur the tricky word all.



HISTORY Year 1 have used their knowledge of Castles to build a Castle using construction equipment. Iris and Arthur made a motte and bailey Castle, with all the features. Jack also used Lego to Create a sword and shield.



PSHE We joined in with the words and actions of a dragon song. In the

song the dragon is happy, sad, angry and excited. We talked about these emotions and showed them with our faces and bodies.

The Nursery Children have listened to the story Night Monkey, Day Monkey. They made rubbings of wild animals and played with the toy animals. They made musical instruments and used them to play along to songs.

Please note! The Reception children have a reading book in a folder with a reading record and a rocket card to sign each day that your child reads. Please only record the reading and your child's responses to the school reading book in the record book, not other books they read. We aim to hear the children read twice a week and will change the book at this time if we think the child is ready for a new one. Please make sure their reading folder is in their bag every day.

Home Learning
