




## Thames Talk

## Learning to bring out the best in everyone.

## Friday 14th February



What a busy week – we have come to the end of another half term. We have enjoyed our space topic this term. Our focus book this week was Roaring Rockets by Tony Mitton and Ant Parker. The Reception children drew themselves in a rocket and labelled it. They used the Camera function in Purple Mash to photograph themselves in a rocket. They also pretended to get dressed for space, then sequenced four pictures and matched sentences to them.

Last week we learnt about Chinese New Year. We watched films about families celebrating Chinese New Year on CBeebies. We wrote facts about Chinese New Year and some of us drew the animals in the order that they crossed the finishing line in the legend of how the Chinese zodiac years got their names. We learnt that this year is the Year of the Snake. We enjoyed pretending to make Chinese food in the kitchen. We also looked at and copied some Chinese writing to make happy new year cards.

LITERACY The Year 1 children have started a non-fiction unit on the seasons. This week we focussed on spring, collecting vocabulary to create sentences.


MATHS Reception have been learning about 14 and 15. The also focussed on recognising and describing 2D shapes, and Capacity. They looked at lots of different containers and then guessed which ones held the most water, then investigated the Capacity of each one and ordered them. They enjoyed using the different containers in the water tray, along with measuring jugs. Year 1 have been solving missing number problems using bar models and part part whole models.

**PHONICS** Reception are revisiting Phase 2, focussing on letter formation of **h b f l ff l ss**, and reading and writing cvc words. Year 1 have continued Phase 5, alternative ways of writing the phoneme or – **aw** (as in saw), **au** (as in sauce), and **al** (as in walk).

CREATIVE The children have used junk modelling and construction kits to make rockets.



HISTORY The Year 1 Children learnt about Mary Seacole, who set up her own hospital to care for soldiers during the Crimea War.



RE The Year 1 children visited St Peter and St Paul's Church to find out more about parables. Reverend Susan taught them the parables of the lost





The Nursery Children have been finding and ordering the letters of their names. They also worked on pencil control. In Phonics they played the silly soup game - sorting objects that begin with the sound s.
